Councillor Taylor to meet with a representative of Stagecoach to discuss the imminent withdrawal of the 72 Bus service and changes to the 42 Route .</li> <li>3. Victoria Road to Reform Street to be closed for 1 day for essential maintenance</li> </ol>	
<p>Questions for Fife Council:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Could the bridge on Coffin Walk be repaired .</li> <li>2. The footpath at the Lay-by by the WWtW has not yet been reinstated .</li> <li>3. Request for some of the £40million allocated for care homes to be directed to Tayport for a residence here .</li> <li>4. A broken branch on a tree in the Council garden requires attention .</li> <li>5. Who or what is the Tayport Kidney Patient Association ?</li> <li>6. Can the grass be cut at the Sandyhill play area</li> <li>7. As the grass bank at the WWtW is becoming very overgrown and untidy , can we find out who is responsible for its maintenance .</li> <li>8. The harbour toilets appear to be closed at normal opening times – can this be investigated .</li> <li>9. The housing site in Ogilvy Place sold by Fife Council has become very unsightly can this be looked into .</li> <li>10. As the quality of the fencing at the new play park is poor could a proper fence be erected .</li> <li>11. Can a programme to clear the grass and weed from the pond be started .</li> <li>12. 2 Lampposts at Jubilee Buildings are badly corroded and need attention .</li> <li>13. Branches are affecting the sight line of the 30mph sign on entering Tayport .</li> <li>14. Could the pavement from the West end of the cemetery be upgraded as the Eastern pavement was .</li> </ol>
